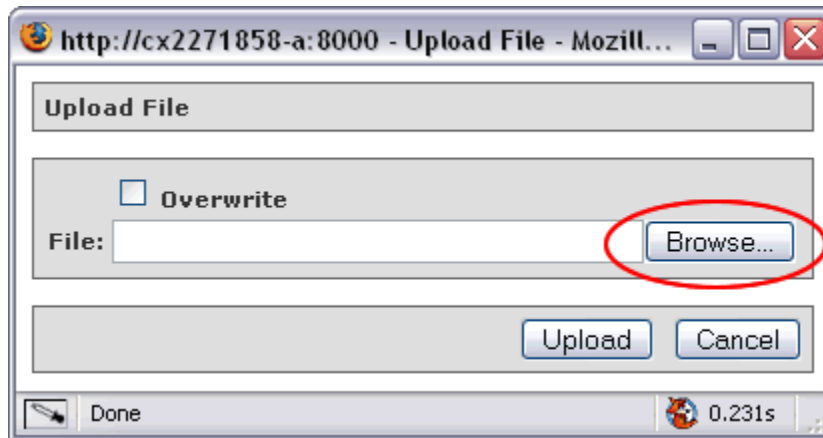
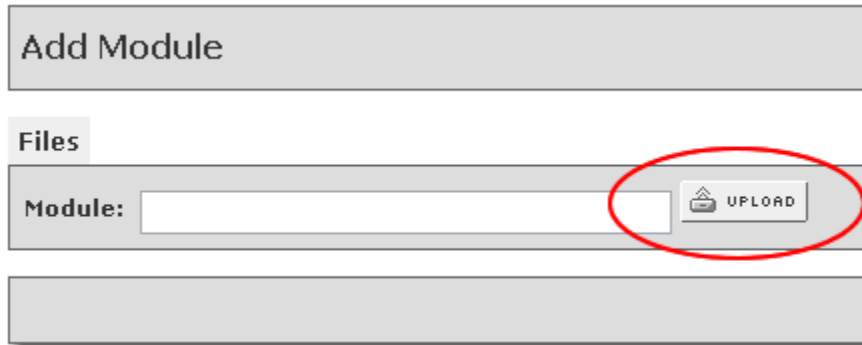
Installation Instructions

Step 1. After purchasing the MIVA Merchant 5 module, download it to your computer. If it was supplied as a Zip file, unzip it to a convenient directory. Winzip is a popular tool for un-zipping files and is available [here](#).

Step 2. Next, upload your new module to your MIVA Merchant administration panel via the “Add” link to the right of the “Modules” link in the left navigation.



Step 3. Click the “Upload” button and select the module to be uploaded and installed. After you select the module click the “Add” button.



Now your module is installed to your MIVA Merchant Domain. Next, we will need to assign the module to the store you want to use it with.

Step 4. Click “System Extension Configuration” within the left navigation under your selected store.

Step 5. Find the “Login Lookup” module, select the checkbox, and hit “Update”.

Step 6. After you hit the “Update” button, a new tab was created called “Login Lookup”. Click on the “Login Lookup” tab. Now that the module is assigned to the store, you will need to enter your license number. Enter your purchased license number and click “Update”. If you do not have a valid license number please contact Sebenza.

Step 7. An “Item” named “*loginlookup*” was created during installation and automatically assigned to your LOGN *Page Template* and ORDL *Page Template*. In order for the Login Lookup module to work correctly, we need to assign the “*loginlookup*” Item to the page templates. Within the LOGN and ORDL Page templates, there is a tab called Items. Click the Items tab to assign “*loginlookup*” item or verify that the correct items are assigned.

Step 8. Add the following line to your LOGN and ORDL page template where you desire the Login Lookup template to be displayed. By default the module has installed it above the page footer item tag.

Note: Do not place this tag within any existing FORM tags

Module Settings

After entering your license key, you will be presented with some administration options for the module.

Those options are:

- 1. Page Template**

This is the modules main template that will display the option to your customers.

- 2. Send Email**

By checking this box, you are opting to send the customer and email containing their username vs displaying on the website.

- 3. Email Template**

This is the template that is emailed to the customer when they request their login. There login is emailed to their password recovery email address. The
 tag will be replaced with line breaks at runtime when not using the html option.

- 4. Subject**

The subject of the login request email

- 5. From**

The from address for the login request email

- 6. HTML?**

Checking this option will allow you to format your email template using html
